PATRIOTIC POLES.

They Commemorate Their Country's Struggle for Independence.

The Polish residents of this city celebrated the sixty-third anniversary of the Polish war for independence on Sunday last.

The exercises began with a solemn requiem mass for the repose of Poland's fallen heroes, celebrated in the church of the Franciscan Fathers, on Golden Gate avenue. At the conclusion of the affair the congregation adjourned to the rooms of the Polish Society of California, 231 Olive street, where the afternoon was passed in literary and patriotic exercises. A number of speeches were delivered, and solemn hymns for the deliverance of Poland were sung, in addition to a number of patriotic and national songs. The remainder of the day was passed in friendly social intercourse.
