

**AID FOR POLAND.**—The Polish Committee in this city have received the following letter of acknowledgment:

PARIS, FRANCE, October 29th, 1863.

*The Polish Committee in Paris to Mr. Lazard,  
President of the Polish Committee in San  
Francisco:*

Mr. President—The Polish Committee in Paris has received the sum of \$2,000, transmitted by you in the name of the Committee of San Francisco, for which amount we have sent a receipt. This new contribution proves the generous sympathy of the citizens of San Francisco for the Polish cause, and our Committee, in renewing their most sincere thanks to you, Mr. President, beg you at the same time to be the interpreter of their sentiments of gratitude to your generous and patriotic fellow citizens.

At the same time when our nation is outraged in her most sacred sentiments, and suffering the most horrible martyrdom, the material and moral aid which you give us, secures an imperishable title to the gratitude of the Polish nation.

Receive, Mr. President, the assurance of our highest consideration.

The whole amount remitted by the Committee at San Francisco is \$8,000, a portion of which was contributed by the citizens of Nevada Territory and British Columbia. In addition to the above, we learn that the Polish Society of this city has remitted \$550 to the Committee at Paris, and that the members contribute monthly for that purpose.
