The celebration by the Polish residents of the Kosciusko centenary is set for next Sunday afternoon.

The Polish citizens have prepared an interesting programme for their celebration of the Kosciusko centenary on next Sunday. Addresses in English will be made by Judge E. W. McKinstry, president of the day; Director-General M. H. de Young, John A. Stanton and Frank Murasky, and a Polish speech will be made by M. Maryanski. The Chevalier de Koutski will play the piano and Mme. Modjeska will recite.

The Kosciusko centenary will be celebrated by Polish citizens at the Fair tomorrow afternoon. On the programme are named the Chevalier de Koutski, the pianist, and Mme. Modjeska, the famous actress. There are to be addresses by Judge E. W. McKinstry, president of the day, Director-General M. H. de Young, John A. Stanton, Frank Murasky and M. Maryanski. Miss Maud Durbin and Miss Kopankiewicz are to recite.

The admission fee this evening as well as during the daytime is 50 cents.
