MEETING OF POLISH—SYMPATHY WITH THEIR STRUGGLING COUNTRYMEN, ETC., ETC.—Last evening a large number of the Polish residents of San Francisco assembled at the Russ House for the purpose of expressing sympathy with their countrymen, now fighting to free their land from the tyranny of Russian despotism. A Committee had been previously elected, whose duty it will be to devise ways and means of enlisting general interest amongst Americans, resident in California, as will convince their struggling brethren that the popular feeling here is with them in their efforts to regain their national independence.

The names of this Committee are as follows, the President acting as Chairman of the meeting:

President, Kazimir Bielawski; Vice-Presidents, Francis Urycishowski, Leon Czaykowski, and Rev. Max Wolfe; Acting Agent on Communications, Rudolf Corwin Piotrowski.

Besides the above there are twelve other acting members of the Society.

The President, in stating the objects of the meeting, remarked that he was pleased to see such large representations from different nations present. They were there to express their sympathy with the heroic struggles of Poland to regain her national independence. Able speakers were present to address them, and he would introduce first Mr. Piotrowski.
