Last Revolt of People Against Russian Rule Is Celebrated by Members

San Francisco Polish societies joined yesterday in a celebration to commemorate the last attempt of Poland to obtain freedom from Russia 50 years ago. A program of speaking and music was given in Golden Gate Commandery hall, 2135 Sutter street.

Alexander Malliszowszski, a survivor of the last Polish revolution, told his Polish-American hearers of the heroism of their ancestors and of their defeat by overwhelming numbers.

Among the interesting features of the program was a tableau, in which about 20 persons took part, representing various phases of country life in Poland.
